day of May 1905, at the age of

About the close of the Civil
war Bro. Barrell was made a
Master Mason and lived a Con-
sistent member till death, ever

him from us. May each of ^{us} be in-
spired, by his timely death, to follow
the example of Bro. Barrell. His

remains were interred on the 12th day
of May 1905, around a sorrowing fra-
ternal body, near his residence at Pine
mountain. With sorrowing hearts we
bid him a last earthly farewell.
